Y3/4 Mixed Football Tournament – Miss Bakes's Red Kite Tournament – 15/05/24

In May, Miss Bakes organised a Year 3/4 mixed football tournament with local Red Kite Schools. Oatlands Junior School, Saltergate, Coppice Valley, Rossett Acre competed. We had two mixed teams for Oatlands. Both teams played so well, with lots of wins and a couple of draws, and were very evenly matched as they finished joint second!



#### Y3/4 Mixed Hockey Tournament – Harrogate Hockey Club – 21/05/2024

Next, Miss Bakes took Grace, Bobbie, James and Ismaeel to Harrogate Hockey Club to compete against 9 other schools in a Year 3/4 hockey tournament. Miss Bakes was so impressed with the team's dedication and energy; it was a very busy day for these 4 children as they had no subs and no rest games in the round robin! They worked their socks off and displayed some very impressive passing, tackling, dribbling and goal keeping. Their sportsmanship and knowledge of rules was excellent – despite their afterschool hockey club, and lessons in PE, happening before Christmas. We are unsure of our standing as only 1<sup>st</sup> place was announced, but the team did well and improved a lot over the afternoon.



#### Y5/6 Girls' Cricket Tournament – Yorkshire Cricket Board – 06/06/2024

In June, we took 10 Year 5/6 girls to Pannal Cricket Club to compete in the first round of the Yorkshire Cricket Board's Y5/6 girls' tournament. We competed against other local schools around the Harrogate area. The team was a mix of club players and children who had a bit of experience of cricket, so a cricket tournament was a new experience for some of our players. Throughout the morning, the girls showed outstanding focus, teamwork, sportsmanship and skills all morning. Bowling and batting improved over the morning, with more 4s and 6s being hit as the tournament progressed. Because of this, the girls finished second overall and were very proud (rightly so!) of their performance.



#### Y5/6 Red Kite Olympics - 07/06/2024

The next day, 6 children competed in the Red Kite Olympics. Teams needed to be an even split of Year 5s and 6s, and boys and girls. Fletcher, Wilf and Jack represented Year 5 and the boys. May, Charlotte and Smiti represented Year 6 and the girls. The morning began with a rounders tournament. There were 2 pools; we won every game in our pool with some very impressive batting and teamwork on the field. We then played the winner of the other pool in the final and won that too, which put us in the lead out of 10 schools in the morning. The afternoon was made up of athletics events: running races and tug of war. Our performances in the running races were fantastic – notably Smiti winning two 100m races back to back and Fletcher coming 1<sup>st</sup> then 2<sup>nd</sup> in 50m – and secured our lead for the final event: tug of war. Tug of war was a tricky one and we adapted our tactics to beat our last 2 opponents. The two wins at tug of war were vital to lead us to victory for the first ever Red Kite Olympics after an impressive performance in rounders and athletics!
